

The Commissioning Service

The Cathedral was buzzing before the service began, with refreshments served by members of Bedlington Deanery. Then Ian Robertson, the Cathedral's Director of Music, played "Tiento da Batalla" by the 18th century Spanish composer Juan Cabanilles, and the service began on the stroke of 11.00 am. Canon Clare McLaren welcomed us on behalf of the Dean and Chapter, and reminded us of all the painstaking work that had gone into the setting of every stitch in the beautiful banners, 15 Branch banners, our own Diocesan and the new Provincial one.

Our new Provincial President June Houghton read from the First Letter of John, and the Bishop of Berwick preached an excellent sermon, taking as his text the line "I desire mercy, not sacrifice" from the Gospel of Matthew. He invited our President and Vice Presidents to share their vision for the next Triennium - that the Trustees would work together in harmony, and that younger people would be encouraged to become Mothers' Union members. Our Diocesan Chaplain Sarah Moon led us in Prayers of Intercession, thanking God for the newly-commissioned (of whom she is one) and for the beauty and variety of our Diocese, and asking that we would all work together to build God's Kingdom and spread God's love.

During Communion the Choir sang the traditional Spiritual "Steal Away to Jesus", and a beautiful worship song by John Fowler called "My prayer for you". After the final rousing hymn Ian played us out with J S Bach's Prelude in E minor BWV548, a glorious climax to an uplifting service.

One of the newly-commissioned was Julian Brown, who becomes Finance and Central Services Co-ordinator. A member of Bishop's Council with a background in accountancy, Julian brings a wealth of experience to the role, which he says he finds a little daunting. But he is determined to do his very best for us, not least as a tribute to his late wife Elizabeth who was formerly Tynemouth Deanery Leader. He brings a new dimension to Trustees' meetings and we shall look forward to working with him.
