1. June Leadership Conference. The Count Down Begins!

This June, our leaders from across Britain and Ireland are heading to Liverpool for an exciting and empowering leadership conference focused on the future of Mothers' Union. It will be an inspiring time of creative thinking and collective action as we gather to strengthen the movement and prepare for our milestone celebration - 150th Anniversary of Mothers' Union!

Workshops and discussions at the conference will also tackle some of the real challenges we face in turning around our declining membership to one that is growing, with a focus on younger people, those aged 40–60, expanding the number of men, and welcoming people from the wider Christian community to our wonderful movement.

Your voice matters. If you have encountered barriers in reaching new audiences to invite into the movement, now is the time to share those challenges with your leaders so they can bring them to the table in Liverpool. Together, we can find real solutions.

Another major feature of the conference will be the launch of the 150th Year National Recruitment & National Fundraising Challenges.



150th **Year Recruitment** - Each diocese will be challenged to recruit 150 new members by December 2026. The prize? A prestigious trophy and the honour of having your diocese's name engraved on a plaque at Mary Sumner House! This is a bold initiative designed to celebrate our heritage while building our future.

These new members can be Branch/Group affiliated members or Diocesan Members; giving you the opportunity to look at your recruitment processes, and how your memberships are structured and supported in your diocese. Have a think about how and who to engage with and let us welcome new people to MU!

150th **Year Fundraising Challenge** - Alongside this, there will be a Fundraising Challenge where every participating group will receive £150 in seed money. The mission is to grow that into a brilliant £1,500! Rumours are already swirling of creative efforts underway; Make & Bake Month, Community Bazaars, Cake Sales, Homemade Jam Sales, Jumble Sales, Sponsored Walks, Bike Rides, and even Swimming Challenges. The energy is building, and the enthusiasm is contagious!

So, what is your diocese planning for 2026 and how will you meet these new national challenges? How will you ensure that your name shines among the top contributors to this landmark celebration?

Let us raise the profile of Mothers' Union, amplify our impact, welcome new people, and step boldly into the next chapter of our story.

4. Dementia Awareness & Support Workshop

In response to feedback from members of the Membership Community of Interest, we are delighted to partner with Enrichment for the Elderly to deliver the Dementia Star awards, a popular and impactful workshop series on dementia care.

The workshop will be three sessions of two hour per sessions held over three consecutive weeks and taking place on the same day and time each week, making it easy to fit into your schedule.

The sessions are divided into Bronze, Silver, and Gold, to offer a progressive learning journey, with each session being interactive and engaging with practical insights and tools to enhance understanding and response to dementia.

Workshop Overview:



Bronze Dementia Star

Gain a foundational understanding of how dementia affects the brain, communication, memory, and how small changes can significantly support those living with dementia.

Silver Dementia Star

Explore how dementia impacts the senses and behaviour and learn how to adjust your approach to provide compassionate support.

Gold Dementia Star

Build on your understanding by recognising different types of dementia, actively including those affected in decisions and applying your learning in real-life settings.

This training will equip members with deeper understanding and practical skills to support and care for those living with dementia, both personally and within our churches and communities.

We have successfully negotiated the cost of this enrichment package to £45 per diocese, covering up to two attendees per diocese.
